Course Description

English III Co-Enrolled course focuses on analysis and composition skills required for college admissions. Emphasis is placed on analyzing the rhetorical situation, claims and evidence, reasoning and organization, and style in both reading and writing. Students will be required to read novels such as Friday Night Lights, Just Mercy, and others-along with Informational and Argumentative texts such as news articles, American Literature speeches, and current events. Each six weeks, students can expect to complete a novel reading assignment, research, and the full writing process with different modes of writing (synthesis, rhetorical, and argumentative).

ENGL 1301/1302

Each student is expected to read and complete all assignments; write a minimum of 2-3 eight hundred to thousand-word essays plus a final exam essay; participate in group discussions; and maintain an appropriate, civil manner in the classroom per semester. The class will be employing the use of Google Classroom and Google Apps. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure access to both.

This course may incorporate essays, projects, discussions, quizzes, journals, and exams to evaluate student performance and to direct instruction. Due to the nature of the course, not every assignment will be thoroughly graded and returned. Unless otherwise noted, students may expect to receive feedback on their assignments no later than 6 class hours (2 weeks) from the date of submission.


It is the student's responsibility to keep copies of all course-related documents, including all assignments submitted or received.
